

### POST-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS FOR DENTAL EXTRACTIONS

#### **Instructions**

- 1. Rest for the remainder of the day.
- 2. Bite on supplied gauze pad for 1 hour to stop bleeding and allow blood clot to form.
- 3. Do not rinse mouth for one day.
- 4. Do not smoke, suck on a straw, spit, or increase pressure in mouth in any way. This will disrupt the blood clot.
- 5. Eat soft foods for 1 day then slowly progress to a normal diet. Avoid seeds.
- 6. After 24 hours you can begin *gently* rinsing your mouth with warm salt water after every meal to remove food debris from the extraction socket.

#### Pain

- 1. Take prescribed pain medication.
- 2. An increase in pain for 2-4 days following extraction is normal. If pain continues to increase as opposed to diminish after 2-4 days, call the office and book a follow-up appointment. Infection or dry socket are likely responsible.

### **Swelling**

1. Swelling and discoloration is expected and will reach its maximum 2-4 days after the extraction. It will slowly diminish after this. A cold pack should be applied to the site of swelling (alternate 20 mins on with 20 mins off) for the first 6-12 hours to help reduce swelling.

#### **Bleeding**

- 1. Redness in saliva is expected. If the extraction site continues to bleed, place a gauze pad over it and apply pressure by biting down. Sit still, do not talk, chew or move around.
- 2. Bleeding is normal within 24 hours, if anything more than that please contact our office.
- 3. If sudden heavy bleeding occurs that you cannot control with gauze and pressure, please head to emergency immediately.

# **Sutures (Stitches)**

1. Will dissolve on their own in 1-2 weeks.

## **Dry Socket**

1. This can be avoided if all the previous recommendations are followed. However, should it happen, it will generally occur from day five, onwards. After 2-4 days post extraction, your healing should slowly, progressively be getting better each day. However, a sudden change in discomfort may indicate dry socket. It can also be accompanied with intense smell and taste. Please contact our office for an appointment if this occurs.
